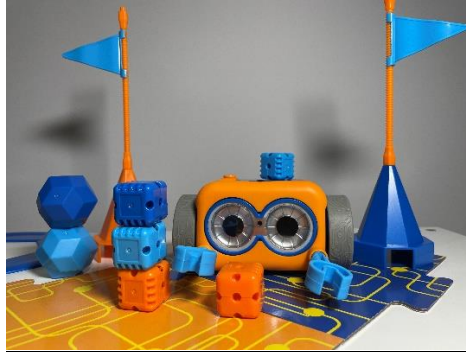


Botley Robots Helpful Tips and Tricks

If you are new to learning this program, Teacher's Pet has many resources to help you become an expert with these robots. You can:

- Watch the training video on the Presenter site
- Review the original user's manual for the Botley robots
- Familiarize yourself with all the concepts covered in our "Exploring Botley's World Intro Video"



If you are presenting at a school where multiple classes are running Botley programs simultaneously, there is a chance that there could be interference with pairing your robots. Classes across the hall should be far enough, but adjacent classrooms are not ideal.

If your remotes and Botley's are failing to connect, here are a couple of things that may help:

1. **Write down your pairing codes** - this is important either way. If you do not do so already, it is helpful to write down the individual code you used to pair each Botley in your kit with its remote. This way, should you need to change it for any reason, you know what other codes you already used for the other Botley's in your kit but also, to compare with the presenter in the next room (should you have this interference trouble). If 2 Botley's from different kits have the same pairing code with their remote, separate these robots as far as possible.
2. **Use the hallway** - it can be difficult to use the hallway for both classes, but if you are trying to create separation between Botley's it doesn't take much more space than heading to the hallway outside the classroom. This is also helpful for Station 3, as students are able to hear the sounds better in a quieter environment.
3. **Suggest a different room** - you can ask if it's possible to use a different room for 1 class that is not next door to the other Botley program. If this is not possible, meet with the other presenter and organize the spaces best you can, consulting your pairing codes so you can change any codes as needed, or separate any that may overlap between the two kits.
